  - (b) State any **TWO** functions of the Deputy President of Kenya. (2 marks)
  - (c) (i) Identify **FOUR** situations that may lead to disqualification of an aspiring member of County Assembly. (4 marks)
    - (ii) State **THREE** functions of the County Governor in Kenya. (3 marks)
  - (d) (i) Name any **TWO** special Courts and Tribunals in Kenya. (2 marks)
    - (ii) Explain **THREE** challenges facing the Prisons Department in Kenya (6 marks)
- 2. You intend to use the sample study technique to teach the sub-topic "Coffee growing in Kenya and Ethiopia" to a standard 6 class.

- (c) Identify **TWO** types of vegetation found in the area covered by the map. (2 marks)
- (d) Citing evidence from the map, give **TWO** economic activities carried out in the area covered by the map. (2 marks)
- (e) Explain **TWO** factors which have influenced human settlement in the area covered by the map. (4 marks)
- (f) Describe the drainage of the area covered by the map. (3 marks)
